What You Can Report

Any activity by UC or a UCR employee that:

- Significantly violates University policy
- Violates a state or federal law or regulation, such as:
 - Corruption
 - Malfeasance
 - Bribery or Fraud
 - Theft or misuse of government property
 - Coercion or Conversion
- Demonstrates economic waste, or involves gross misconduct, gross incompetence, or gross inefficiency
- Note that discrimination and harassment and retaliation are also significant violations of policy and may be reported through the hotline or to UCR's Office of Civil Rights at civilrights@ucr.edu

How You Can Report

- In writing or verbally (phone call)
- With as much specific factual information as possible
- Anonymously, if preferred

Protection from Retaliation

If you believe you have been retaliated against for making a whistleblower report, you may file a complaint with your Locally Designated Official, Human Resources (Employee & Labor Relations), or your supervisor. They will refer the matter to the LDO.
